Newburgh Town Council Minutes

The Newburgh Town Council met in Executive Session on Wednesday, April 9, 2008, at 4:30p.m. Those present were Anne Rust Aurand, Eric Ellsperman, Bill Kavanaugh, Alonzo Moore, Shari Sherman, Becky Gentry, Cynthia Burger, and Chris Wischer. The purpose of the meeting was discussion of personnel issues and was held in accordance with Indiana Code 5-14-1.5-6.

CALL TO ORDER

The Regular Session was called to order at 5:30p.m. by President Kavanaugh.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by the Newburgh Town Council. A moment of silence was observed for Delbert Wayne Healy.

DISCUSSION: The Council thanked Mrs. Smith for her community service and involvement in the Senior Citizen community throughout the years. Phillip Smith, Mrs. Smith's son, said the following. "She's a good Mom. Mom has always been part of Newburgh and we've enjoyed growing up here and living here all of our life. The whole

family is very proud of everything she's done to get the Senior Citizen Center where it is now. Out of sharing the fire station where it was and where it was before that. We appreciate everything you're doing and the day in her honor, we thank you very much."

COMMISSION REPORTS

AIR BOARD ~ Eric Ellsperman

No report.

FIRE ~ Alonzo Moore

Work continues on the fire protection contract with the Ohio Township Trustee. Chief Lueken reported that three (3) new firefighters have taken the mandatory test for the state. Two (2) firefighters are being dive certified.

Capt. Paul Campbell recently was awarded a Kiwanis Safety Award. The Council will send a letter of recognition for his accomplishment.

Chief Lueken presented the March run report (see attached).

PARK ~ Eric Ellsperman

Dianna Phillips has been hired as the 2008 pool manager. Paul Dobrynski will be the assistant pool manager. Applications are being received for guards and concession workers with interviews conducted in the near future.

IHOP will reopen on Friday, April 11, 2008.

Reimann Electric has been working with Ms. Burger and Mr. Hijuelos to prepare figures and a layout to update the electrical and lighting system at the old Lock & Dam. Mr. Kavanaugh requested that the Park Board also investigate the cost of a new sound system.

PLAN ~ Anne Rust Aurand

At their recent meeting, the Plan Commission approved the rezoning request for 5455 Hwy. 261 for R-1 to C-1, approving sixteen (16) of the thirty-two (32) possible uses. The rezoning ordinance should come before the Newburgh Town Council at the April 23, 2008, meeting for consideration.

Discussion was also held regarding the addition of a food pantry and storage to the existing Mother Teresa's. Drawings were submitted. The renovation was tentatively approved pending adequate parking and handicap parking spaces.

POLICE ~ Bill Kavanaugh

Chief Sprinkle presented March statistics (see attached).

Principal Rick Reid met with Chief Sprinkle to discuss the temporary no parking signs that were placed on Filmore Street (from the new section of the school to First Street) at the beginning of the school year.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman for legal to prepare an ordinance for the April 23, 2008, meeting that would prohibit parking on both sides of Filmore Street from the school to First Street.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: None

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

Asst. Chief Williams has researched an ALCOA grant that relates to the safety of children. If awarded, funding would be used to provide a school safety patrol person. MOTION by Mr. Moore for the Newburgh Police Department to pursue the ALCOA grant.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: Chief Sprinkle is hopeful that funding would provide the patrol person for two (2) years.

MOTION carried ayes 4, nays 0, abstentions 1 (Sherman).

STREET ~ Alonzo Moore

Approximately four and a half (4½) tons of black top have been used to repair pot holes throughout town. Mulch has also been applied around the Senior Citizen Center and the town parking lot.

Interviews will be held in the near future for the street superintendent position.

UTILITY ~ Shari Sherman

MOTION by Ms. Sherman that a letter be sent to Spectronics to advise that they have fifteen (15) days (from April 2, 2008) to comply with the NOV sent from the Town of Newburgh on March 10, 2008.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: Ms. Sherman stated this was the second attempt for compliance.

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to amend the Town of Newburgh Sewer Construction Standards indicating the KSB pumps are not an acceptable brand due to the fact that it is very difficult and a lengthy process to acquire parts which causes the Town's system to be subject to bypass and overflow situations contrary to the CMOM program.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: Ms. Sherman stated it was not unusual for it to take nine (9) to twelve (12) months to receive parts from Germany.

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to purchase a Myers replacement pump for Talbert Ridge Lift Station from Straeffler Pump & Supply in an amount not to exceed \$4,700.00.

SECOND by Mr. Moore.

DISCUSSION: None

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to approve three (3) sewer adjustments for Deaconess for the first quarter totaling \$12,854.75.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: Because the calculation is so cumbersome for these adjustments, the board is considering a surcharge.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to approve the mediation agreement with Deig Bros. Lumber & Construction for the Phelps Drive project.

The Council previously approved applying for certified local government recognition from the state which allows the town to apply for and receive various grants. The application has been submitted and the commission is awaiting response.

An Open House is scheduled for Sunday, April 20, 2008, from 1:00p.m. until 3:00p.m. A ceremony will be held at 1:00p.m. and tours will follow. Landscaping has been completing. The third (and final) set of exterior lights have been installed.

STORM WATER ~ Anne Rust Aurand

The next meeting will be held on April 21, 2008. No problems have been reported due to the recent rainfalls.

VETERANS MONUMENT ~ Shari Sherman

All concrete work has been completed except for the section on the plaza. Mr. Hynes reported that the stone base for the plaza area is down. Leveling sand will be placed between the stone base and the pavers. Limestone is being cut for the wall which is in the process of being installed. The flag pole has been delivered.

TOWN ENGINEER ~ David Hynes

The old Lock & Dam wall, or "Shirley's Wall", is nearly complete. Mr. Hynes pointed out that an area at the top of the ridge needs attention. He suggested adding an additional layer of stone.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to approve change order no. 1 in the amount of \$4,485.00.

The invoice for property insurance premiums (approved at the previous meeting) came in \$1,980.00 less than it was quoted.

Ms. Aurand commended the Rose Hill Cemetery Board for their work on the restoration and rededication of the Civil War cannon.

Newburgh Elementary will hold their first tract meet on April 22, 2008. Discussion was held regarding the possibility of rehabbing the old concession stand and bathroom at the old Kiwanis Park.

PETITIONS AND COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS PRESENT

Pam Hijuelos, 112 Washington and Director of the Newburgh Senior Center, stated seniors would be holding a Spring Arts Festival on Friday, April 25, 2008. The public is invited to attend.

Scott Thompson, a resident of Blue Lake, encouraged the Council to move forward with the Blue Lake Lift Station project. Ms. Sherman assured Mr. Thompson that Blue Lake was at the top of the list. Mr. Hynes anticipates the contract award by the end of May.

WHEREAS, her commitment to the seniors of our community is a model for us all, and

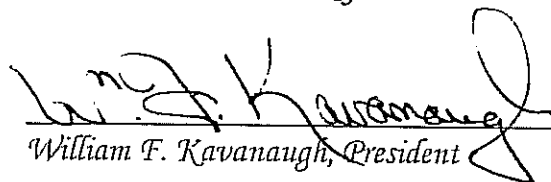

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

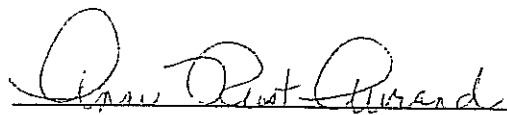

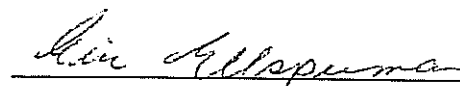

RT update

Land acquisition: One parcel has been purchased by the town. Offers have been made and accepted for parcel II and III. They will be approved with the acceptance of the register of claims this evening.

A meeting was held 04/04/08 with Structurepoint, ATC (the geotech consultant) and Bobbie Howard, WC Engineer. The discussion was w/r/t the road failure east of town on SR 662.

Structurepoint is preparing cost estimates for what a trail repair would have cost if the trail had already been constructed along SR 662 where the road failure occurred recently.

Structurepoint has three (3) questions for Council and WC regarding the road and trail east of town:

1. accept the concept of slope and road failures, the needed repairs, and the cost to fix them;
2. consider the global fix along that entire corridor with tie back walls or maybe rip rap (which would mean cutting the tree canopy)...the cost estimate is over \$10 million dollars...and try to find funding;
3. make SR 662 one way east of Westervelt /Belle Rive and place the trail in the southern lane. This would have much less impact when there are slope failures and could be accomplished with no land ac and at a much lesser cost than originally estimated. Bobbie Howard is taking this option to WC for consideration at this time.

Current timeline:

- Geotech should be completed for phase I mid April – mid May depending on weather. ATC are waiting for it to dry out in the great ravine to complete the borings. Right of entry has finally been secured for parcels II and III.
- Final plans should be delivered from Structurepoint to INDOT by June 1, 2008.
- Structurepoint is approaching INDOT for an August bid letting date for phase I.
