

Newburgh Town Council Minutes
Wednesday, August 13, 2008

The Newburgh Town Council met in Executive Session on Wednesday, August 13, 2008, at 4:30p.m. Those present were Anne Rust Aurand, Eric Ellsperman, Bill Kavanaugh, Alonzo Moore, Shari Sherman, Becky Gentry, Cynthia Burger, and Tom Bodkin. The purpose of the meeting was discussion of personnel issues and was held in accordance with Indiana Code 5-14-1.5-6.

The Regular Session was called to order at 5:45p.m. by President Bill Kavanaugh.

COMMISSION REPORTS

AIR BOARD ~ Eric Ellsperman

FIRE ~ Alonzo Moore

Four (4) firefighters have completed basic training and are now in their certification phase of training.

PARK ~ Eric Ellsperman
Mr. Hijuelos reported that the lock and dam electrical project is progressing well. The underground conduit is in place and recovered and all the concrete bases for the light poles have been poured. The project should be complete in approximately two (2) weeks as according to plan.

PLAN ~ Anne Rust Aurand
Discussion was held regarding the fines the Plan Commission wanted to levy against contractors at 111 Hillcrest. Mr. Bodkin explained that the commission does not have the right to levy a fine, only the Town Council can do so.

POLICE ~ Bill Kavanaugh
Chief Sprinkle provided the July statistics (see attached).

The department is utilizing the voice stress machine. Both Chief Sprinkle and Officer Scully are asked to use it frequently by other departments. The confession ration is up approximately 80%.

National Night Out was a huge success again this year.

STREET ~ Alonzo Moore
Councilman Moore stated the crew has been working replacing a culvert at 4th & Monroe. They have also been spraying the riverbank.

Cores have been taken to determine the best plan of action for paving this year. The Council, Ms. Burger, and Mr. Hynes will be attending the Storm Water Management meeting to determine drainage issues vs. street issues.

UTILITY ~ Shari Sherman

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to allow a lateral sewer connection via private easement rather than a sewer main extension to the connection point located at 4144 Wyntree Drive for the reason that no other lot will benefit from the main extension.

DISCUSSION: Ms. Sherman stated the sewer was currently on top of the ground at the end of Forest Park Drive.

DISCUSSION: The property is located in Fall Creek at the corner of Epworth & Lincoln.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to approve the replacement of a defective MH No. 14-212, located at Fernwood Apartments in Newburgh Heights, at a cost not to exceed \$4,000.00 by Republic Companies, Inc.

DISCUSSION: The buried manholes previously existed in an agricultural area and were buried to allow farming over the top of the structures. The structures are now located in a commercial area and need to be raised.




