Newburgh Town Council Meeting

The Newburgh Town Council met in Executive Session on Wednesday, December 10, 2008, at 4:40p.m. Those present were Anne Rust Aurand, Eric Ellsperman, Bill Kavanaugh, Alonzo Moore, Shari Sherman, Cynthia Burger, and Tom Bodkin. The purpose of the meeting was discussion of personnel issues and was held in accordance with Indiana Code 5-14-1.5-6.

CALL TO ORDER

The Regular Session was called to order on Wednesday, December 10, 2008, at 5:45p.m. by President Kavanaugh.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Brady Rogers, Johnny Puckett, Nathaniel Crow, and Brandon Puckett. These Boy Scouts are from Troop 379.

A moment of silence was observed for the passing of Mr. Lawrence Heck, father of Street Superintendent John Heck.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MOTION by Ms. Aurand to approve the November 24, 2008, minutes.

COMMISSION REPORTS

AIR BOARD ~ Eric Ellsperman

The next meeting will be held on December 15, 2008.

FIRE ~ Alonzo Moore

Mr. Moore presented the November run report (see attached).

PARK ~ Eric Ellsperman

MOTION by Mr. Ellsperman to move forward on the renovation of the Lockmaster Cottages per the Park Board recommendation.

SECOND by Mr. Moore.

DISCUSSION: Bids will be opened on December 29, 2008, Council meeting. Funding for the renovation will be provided through EDIT bonds.

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

Mr. Ellsperman reported that Sir Brit Car Club donated \$500.00 that will be used toward the renovation of the Lock & Dam Control Building.

MOTION by Mr. Ellsperman to award the contract for renovation of the Lock & Dam Control Building to Blue Ribbon Construction in the following amounts:

Base bid ~ \$23,500.00

Alternate #1 ~ \$3,480.00 (remove existing wall finish in restrooms and apply ceramic tile)

Alternate #3 ~\$3,500.00 (remove all ceiling and ceiling grid, spray foam insulation on underside of deck, then paint underside and grid black.

SECOND by Mr. Moore.

DISCUSSION: Mr. Hijuelos stated that alternate #2 was for exterior painting that would need to be completed in warmer weather. Work will begin in January with rentals to resume in March 2009.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to amend the motion to include Alternate #2 (exterior paint) in the amount of \$4,040.00.

SECOND by Mr. Moore.

MOTION (main) to award the contract to Blue Ribbon Construction to include the base bid and all three (3) alternates for a total not to exceed \$34,520.00 carried ayes 5, nays 0.

POLICE ~ Bill Kavanaugh

Chief Brett Sprinkle presented the November statistics (see attached).

Officer Jonathan Scully was recognized by Chief Sprinkle for his dedication and hard work while working on two (2) cases at the same time. The first case involved arson at Sycamore Place Apartments on July 16, 2008. Through Officer Scully's ability to interview witnesses and his knowledge of prior situations leading up to this case, two (2) dangerous suspects were apprehended. The second case took place on July 10, 2008, and involved the theft money for the Newburgh boat ramp and coke machines located at the Newburgh pool. Chief Sprinkle commended Officer Scully for his commitment to the Newburgh Police Department and to the citizens of Newburgh. Officer Jonathan Scully was presented with the Newburgh Police Department merit award.

STREET ~ Alonzo Moore

The crew was recently requested to clean a drainage ditch at Section and Adams Street in hopes it would correct the water backup. It was determined that the problem existed due to a break in an IN-American water line.

Signs to prohibit parking on Water Street have been installed.

Richard Arthur has stepped up during the time Street Superintendent John Heck has been on bereavement leave for his father. Mr. Arthur has instructed the new employees on the use of the snow plow and salt spreader.

The crew also assisted the Newburgh merchants in putting up the Christmas tree.

UTILITY ~ Shari Sherman

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to engage Commonwealth Engineers, Inc. for engineering design and prepare to bid the South Broadview Sewer Rehabilitation project.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: None

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to approve Amendment No. 3 to Authorization 2006-6 with Commonwealth Engineers, Inc. for the Lincoln Avenue Widening Utility Relocation which increases the original contract in an amount to exceed \$6,100.00 for construction engineering and \$18,300 for Resident Project Representative services.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to approve the Amendment to Authorization 2008-6 with Commonwealth Engineers, Inc. for the Powers Place Lift Station Relocation in an hourly contract in an amount not to exceed \$8,600.00 for construction engineering and \$58,400.00 for Resident Project Representative services.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: Ms. Sherman credited Office Manager Shawn Mundy for compiling the comprehensive office manual. She commended Mrs. Mundy for her hard work.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to amend the contract with Commonwealth Engineers, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$13,000.00 to update the PER for the Lynch Road project.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to promote Leroy Goldsberry to the position of WWTF Collection System Supervisor at an hourly rate of \$19.40, effective December 15, 2008. Mr. Goldsberry will be permitted the use of a Town owned vehicle which may be driven within a two (2) hour radius of Newburgh.




