

February 19, 2008
Newburgh Town Council Minutes

The Newburgh Town Council met in Executive Session on Tuesday, February 19, 2008, at 4:30p.m. Those present were Anne Rust Aurand, Eric Ellsperman, Alonzo Moore, Shari Sherman, Becky Gentry, and Cynthia Burger. The purpose of the meeting was discussion of personnel issues and was held in accordance with Indiana Code 5-14-1.5-5.

Mr. Moore, Mr. Bodkin, and Ms. Burger continue work on the Ohio Township Fire Protection Contract. Ohio Township Trustee Lorraine Wittenbraker presented an amended short term contract.

DIRECTOR OF PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT ~ Frank Hijuelos

The State of Indiana has published new building codes that are expected to be approved later this year. All the changes were reviewed today in a workshop that Mr. Hijuelos attended.

A LEPC 101 session (emergency preparedness) will be held at St. Mary's Hospital (Warrick) on Thursday, February 21, 2008, from 5:30p.m. until 7:30p.m. All elected officials are invited to attend.

A table top earthquake preparedness exercise will be held in April. The exact date will be determined at a later time.

Section 126, opposing the Cash Creek Power Plant, will be filed in the near future.

TOWN ENGINEER ~ David Hynes

Mr. Hynes stated that work on the Veterans Monument project will resume as soon as weather permits.

The SR 66 sanitary sewer relocation project (phase II) is over the contract days. Mr. Hynes anticipates presenting a change order at the February 27, 2008, meeting that will pinpoint the number of days required to complete to project.

The Heathervale Lift Station has been in operation since Thursday, February 14, 2008.

The sanitary sewer relocation necessary for the Lincoln Avenue widening project is ready to begin work within the next few weeks.

The Park Master Plan was submitted to DNR in January. Many positive comments were noted by DNR with some additional information requested. Mr. Hynes and Ms. Burger will respond to them by the April 15, 2008, deadline.

ownership. The estimated cost to replace the engine is \$11,000.00. Approximately \$7,400.00 has been turned over to the town by the merchants for repairs.

Randy Kennedy, 206 Yorkshire, requested the town consider moving the (Rivertown) trail to go across the northeast corner of the woods.

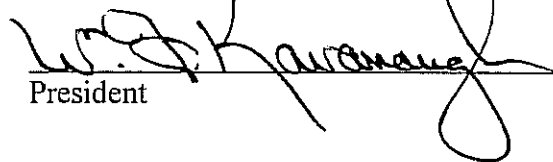

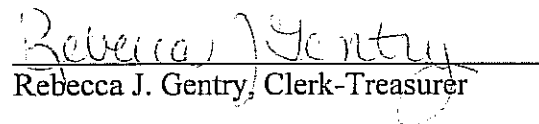
