

Newburgh Town Council Meeting
June 11, 2008

The Newburgh Town Council met in Executive Session on Wednesday, June 11, 2008, at 4:30p.m. Those present were Anne Rust Aurand, Eric Ellsperman, Bill Kavanaugh, Alonzo Moore, Shari Sherman, Becky Gentry, Cynthia Burger, and Tom Bodkin. The purpose of the meeting was discussion of personnel issues and contract negotiations and was held in accordance with Indiana Code 5-14-1.5-6.

CALL TO ORDER

The Regular Session was called to order by President Kavanaugh at 5:30p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by the Newburgh Town Council. A moment of silence was observed for the passing of Dr. Siegfried Weng.

ROLL CALL

Those present were Anne Rust Aurand, Eric Ellsperman, Bill Kavanaugh, Alonzo Moore, Shari Sherman, Becky Gentry, Cynthia Burger, and Tom Bodkin.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MOTION by Mr. Moore to approve the minutes correcting page no. 3 with Mr. Moore listed as the commissioner for the HPC. Additionally, page no. 8 should read "There is a fence encroachment."

SECOND by Ms. Aurand.

DISCUSSION: None

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

COMMISSION REPORTS

AIR BOARD ~ Eric Ellsperman

No report.

FIRE ~ Alonzo Moore

Asst. Chief Timmel provided the May run report (see attached).

The windshield on Engine 11 was broken necessitating an emergency repair in the amount of \$1,411.92.

POLICE ~ Bill Kavanaugh

Asst. Chief Williams, Willard James, and Mike Perry have been working on the boat loaned to the department by Warrick County. Renovations will include paint, decals/stickers, radio, lights, siren, flooring and carpeting. The department has completed a two (2) hour training course with a DNR officer. Chief Sprinkle is investigating government funding that would provide overtime pay for officers.

Because the gate has been removed at IHOP (due to SR 66 widening project) the department is providing extra patrol.

Chief Sprinkle provided the May statistics (see attached).

STREET ~ Alonzo Moore

Two (2) mowers have been purchased for the department. Mr. Moore complimented the work of all the crew, stating the seasonal help was working out well.

The Fourth & Monroe Street project has been completed.

Mr. Moore stated the Monroe, Posey, and Gray intersection was narrow and wasn't sure there was width for a stripe on the street. It was decided to investigate the possibility of placing a stop sign on one of the side streets. Chief Sprinkle and Mr. Moore will review the location again. Chief Sprinkle will also speak with the Newburgh Elementary School principal and request that deliveries are not made in that intersection.

UTILITY ~ Shari Sherman

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to support the concept of a temporary holding tank for the Fritz property in I-164 until the Colonial Hills Lift Station is constructed.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: This would benefit both the town and the Fritz's.

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman that Aqua Aerobic Software provides a quotation for a programming upgrade for the computer operating system at the Wastewater Treatment Facility.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: This program will enable Mr. Key to operate the system on the computer rather than manual operation during heavy rainfall periods.

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman for Commonwealth Engineers to come forward with an amended PER to include the additional hydraulic capacity of the new Wastewater Treatment Facility to 24 million gallons per day.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: None

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to approve Amendment to Authorization 2004-01 Owner-Engineer Authorization with Commonwealth Engineers, Inc.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: Upgrades need to be performed and this authorization is needed.

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to authorize payment of certification bonuses in the amount of \$500.00 to Wayne Bradley (acquired an IWEA CS-III) and Bryan Bodkin (acquired an IWEA CS-II).

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: None

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to engage Commonwealth Engineers to study the Royal Highlands gas main conflict and to propose a solution to the overlapping of lines.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: None

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to pay Lawrence Feller \$500.00 for the loss of his tree and to remove the tree from his property.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: The tree was in the MLS easement. Ms. Burger stated Mr. Feller no longer requested the town remove the tree from his property. Ms. Sherman requested that be included in the release.

MOTION carried ayes 5, nays 0.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman that saddle tap inspections be billed at a minimum of one (1) hour and then in one (1) hour increments thereafter.

SECOND by Mr. Ellsperman.

DISCUSSION: The initial inspection lasted only twenty (2) minutes. It is unknown how long subsequent inspections could take.

FINANCE ~ Anne Rust Aurand

The final audit report with the State Board of Accounts was presented to the committee on Thursday, June 5, 2008.

PERSONNEL ~ Bill Kavanaugh

MOTION by Mr. Kavanaugh to accept with regret the resignation of Shannon Cook from the Wastewater Treatment Facility effective June 11, 2008. Shannon is resigning in good standing and is entitled to accrued but unused PTO.

SPECIAL BOARD/COMMITTEE REPORTS

ARTS PAVILION ~ Eric Ellsperman

No report.

HISTORIC PRESERVATION ~ Alonzo Moore

Mr. Hijuelos explained that the town applied for Certified Local Government status. As applicants, two (2) scholarships were awarded to attend the National Conference in New Orleans on July 10, 2008. Tonya McGuire and Frank Hijuelos will attend on behalf of the HPC. The scholarship covers the cost of the convention, transportation, and lodging. There will be no cost to the town.

PRESERVATION HALL ~ Anne Rust Aurand

The town has applied to be nominated for the IACT annual award. The "Community Achievement Award" nomination is for renovation of the Newburgh Town Hall, the Ohio Township Library, and Preservation Hall.

The town is hosting the IACT Roundtable on Tuesday, June 17, 2008, at Ebenezer Hall in Preservation Hall.

RIVERTOWN TRAIL ~ Eric Ellsperman

The geotech report was approved by INDOT last week. No action has been taken on the construction inspection contract. The town awaits approval of the scoring from INDOT. The project remains on track for September bid letting for Phase I.

STORM WATER ~ Anne Rust Aurand

The Fourth & Monroe can be done "in house", possibly in three (3) stages.

Permits need to be obtained for the Army Corps of Engineers prior to moving forward with the Forest Park project, Phases I and II.

VETERANS MONUMENT ~ Shari Sherman

The monument will be dedicated on July 26, 2008, at 9:00a.m.

CLERK-TREASURER ~ Becky Gentry

Mrs. Helms and Mrs. Gentry attended the Indiana League of Municipal Clerks and Treasurers meeting in Evansville.

DIRECTOR OF PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT ~ Frank Hijuelos

Certified letters were sent to the owners of 4 Gray Street and Third & Monroe. These "fix up/ tear down" letters gives the owners thirty (30) days to repair (to town standard) or demolish the structures.

The Emergency Plan is currently being updated. An amateur ham operator who resides on Water Street has offered his assistance in the event of an emergency.

Mandatory NIMS training for required EDC personnel will be held prior to October 2008.

TOWN ATTORNEY ~ Tom Bodkin

An opinion from the Indiana Court of Appeals has been received regarding Pressley vs. the Town of Newburgh. The opinion confirmed the trial courts decision that Ms. Pressley's house on Water Street is in the historic district. The plaintiff's attorney has thirty (30) days to seek transfer to the Indiana Supreme Court.

The town has filed a brief in the matter of Chandler vs. In-American Water.

TOWN ENGINEER ~ Mike Feltz

Mr. Feltz presented a map with showing the proposed 2008-2009 pavement improvement program for the town. Ms. Burger will review the map and make recommendations.

TOWN ADMINISTRATIVE MANAGER ~ Cynthia Burger

The quarterly safety meeting was held this week. Recommendations were made to update the manual.

Ms. Burger met with an INDOT representative earlier today to discuss the tree, fence, and gate removal at IHOP and SR 662. The intent is to have three (3) lanes from the old road bed to SR662 as the new ingress and egress. Ms. Burger will meet with a representative from the Army Corps of Engineers to discuss a solution to the gate and fence issue (per the agreement the town is to secure IHOP from dusk to dawn)

The town has been certified by INDOT with twenty-one point four (21.4) miles.

The Riversweep will be held on June 21, 2008. Those participating will be required to sign a waiver of release.

Petitions are being circulated throughout the area regarding the certification of the Delta Queen. A resolution will be presented for consideration later in the meeting.

MOTION by Ms. Sherman to surplus and declare of no value a Mita DC 1855 copier from the Street Department.

DISCUSSION: The copier cannot be repaired, is used infrequently, and does not need to be replaced.




