Newburgh Town Council Minutes

The Newburgh Town Council met in Executive Session on Wednesday, March 11, 2009, at 4:30p.m. Those present were Anne Rust Aurand, Eric Ellsperman, Bill Kavanaugh, Alonzo Moore, Shari Sherman, Becky Gentry, Cynthia Burger, and Tom Bodkin. The purpose of the meeting was discussion of personnel issues and was held in accordance with Indiana Code 5-14-1.5-6.

CALL TO ORDER

President Kavanaugh called the Regular Session to order at 5:30p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mason McGowan. Mason, representing Boy Scout Troop 305, is currently working on Citizenship in the Community merit badge.

Chief Campbell presented the February run report (see attached).

PARK ~ Eric Ellsperman

The board met recently and discussed ideas for the skate park. Discussion will be held at the next meeting (March 19) to discuss the position of pool manager. Pool fees were set and are as follows:

- Family pass (resident) on or before May 23 will be \$100.00, after May 23 \$120.
- Family pass (non-resident) on or before May 23 will be \$120, after May 23 \$140
- Swim lesson (resident and nonresident) will be \$50

Adult swims will not be available this year.

Renovation to the Lock & Dam Control Building is expected to be finished by Thursday, March 12, 2009. Rental rates for the building remain unchanged.

PLAN ~ Anne Rust Aurand

POLICE ~ Bill Kavanaugh
Chief Sprinkle presented February statistics (see attached).

STREET ~ Alonzo Moore
The crew has completed limb cleanup at the Newburgh Senior Citizen Center and Newburgh Community Park. They were also recently trained in FEMA requirements for debris removal and monitored Allied Waste during the ice storm debris pickup. The crew was complimented on a job well done.

MOTION by Mr. Moore to move forward, if necessary, with two (2) condemnation proceedings to obtain temporary easements needed for the HES Grant (realignment of Plum, Main & Jennings).

SECOND by Ms. Aurand.

DISCUSSION: The property in question belongs to Steven & Julie Nicholson, 110 Washington and Steven Phillips, 111 Plum Street. Mr. Bodkin reported that his office is working with Mr. Phillips and is hopeful condemnation will not be required for his property. The Nicholson's, however, have received four (4) letters regarding the easements and have been contacted directly but have not responded. Mr. Bodkin stated these are temporary easements, required by the state to complete the project.

Phase I construction is underway. Phase II is still in the design phase with bid letting expected this summer. U of E students will be at the job site during the reconstruction of the historic bridge.

David Hynes reported that plans have been submitted to INDOT for review for the Safe Routes to School project. INDOT intends to use the project as a model. Preliminary design for Jefferson Street is still about one (1) month out.

TOWN MANAGER ~ Cynthia Burger

Ms. Burger reported that a number of trees were lost at IHOP in the recent ice storm. A contractor has been hired for this project since FEMA will reimburse for the cost of removing these trees in the roadway. Town employees will clean up the remaining debris. Other (FEMA) reimbursable costs include snow removal, overtime, equipment use, and equipment rental. FEMA will conduct a meeting next week with Ms. Burger attending.

The contract for phase III of the SR 66 widening project (French Island Trail to Yankeetown Road) has been awarded. This portion of the project is scheduled for completion in July 2011.

Ms. Burger discussed various issues involving the Indiana Economic Recovery money as well as the ARRA (American Recovery & Reinvestment) money. Approximately \$6,000,000.00 ARRA money has been awarded to the Evansville MPO. Of those funds, Newburgh will receive \$1,000,000.00 which will be used for the Rivertown Trail.

A transportation advisory committee has been formed and is looking into public transportation in Warrick County.
