Newburgh Town Council Meeting

The Newburgh Town Council met in Executive Session on Wednesday, October 14, 2009, at 4:30p.m. Those present at the meeting were Anne Rust Aurand, Eric Ellsperman, Bill Kavanaugh, Alonzo Moore, Shari Sherman, Becky Gentry, Cynthia Burger, and Tom Bodkin. The purpose of the meeting was contract negotiations and was held in accordance with Indian Code 5-14-1.5-6.

CALL TO ORDER

President Kavanaugh called the Regular Session to order at 5:30p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by the Newburgh Town Council. A moment of silence was observed for our troops.

Asst. Chief Timmel thanked the Council for their assistance in making the NVFA Open House a great success.

PARK ~ Eric Ellsperman

MOTION by Mr. Ellsperman to purchase additional furnishings (see attached) from Oak Express in the amount of \$3,515.00.

POLICE ~ Bill Kavanaugh

Chief Sprinkle presented the September statistics report.

Sgt. Gary Brown will be retiring as of November 30, 2009. Sgt. Brown has served on the NPD for seventeen (17) years.

MOTION by Mr. Kavanaugh to allow Sgt. Brown to keep his duty weapon.

SECOND by Ms. Sherman.

DISCUSSION: The value of the gun is approximately \$700.00.

A retirement celebration will be held for Sgt. Brown in November.

MOTION by Mr. Kavanaugh to lease/purchase (from Old National Bank) two (2) vehicles in the amount of \$62,000.00. The vehicles purchased will be a 2010 Dodge Charger and a 2010 Ford Expedition.

DISCUSSION: The new vehicles will be purchased at state bid and will replace a Ford Crown Victoria and a Ford Explorer. The Crown Victoria will be declared of no value and sold at auction. The Ford Explorer will remain in the vehicle pool. The cost of the Dodge Charger is \$27,689.60 and the cost of the Explorer is \$34,262.48. These prices reflect fully equipped vehicles.

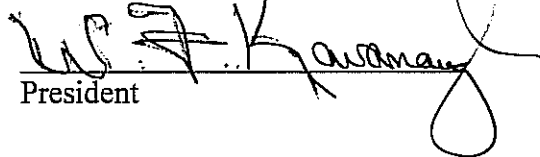

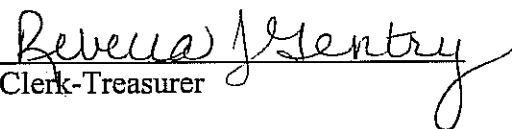
