

Newburgh Town Council Minutes
September 23, 2009

The Newburgh Town Council met in Executive Session on Wednesday, September 23, 2009, at 4:30p.m. Those present at the meeting were Anne Rust Aurand, Eric Ellsperman, Bill Kavanaugh, Alonzo Moore, Shari Sherman, Becky Gentry, Cynthia Burger, and Tom Bodkin. Phase I is nearly complete. Landscaping plants have not yet arrived. The posts for the signs have arrived but the signs have not. Signs and striping are expected next week.

A December bid letting is expected for Phase II A and II B.

Mr. Ellsperman presented two (2) advice of change requests to INDOT. RW Armstrong will submit them to INDOT today. DES #0401025 is the trail phase I with a programmed amount of \$1,049,000.00 per the contract with INDOT. Des #0501256 is the bridge portion with the programmed amount of \$651,000.00 per the INDOT contract. These are federal dollars numbers. The 20% match on all this is with match credits.

Safe Routes to School

Ms. Burger and Mr. Hynes met with Brian Harbison from Green 3 on the section 106 environmental document. They walked both sides of Jennings from Washington to Monroe and both sides of State from Main to Sharon. Some areas of sidewalks are fine

and will not need to be changed. They are working with the environmental document to mitigate any historic areas which primarily involves the existing trees.

Ms. Burger and Mr. Hynes also met with four (4) of the six (6) property owners along Jefferson Street from Main to Park Drive to gauge buy-in. All seemed fairly agreeable and in favor of the project.

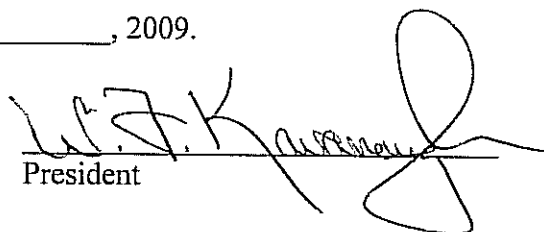

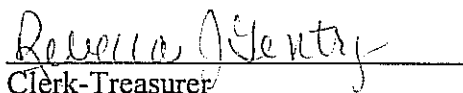
